

David Phillip Jones, QC — grew up in Calgary, studied economics and political science at McGill University and law as a Rhodes Scholar at Oxford University. For 16 years, he was a full-time law professor at McGill and the University of Alberta. His subjects included administrative law, constitutional law, property, taxation, and government control of business. Since 1988, he has been in private practice in Edmonton with the “cerebral micro-firm” of de Villars Jones. He is the Conflict of Interest Commissioner for the Yukon and Northwest Territories Legislative Assemblies, and Chancellor of the Anglican Church of Canada. Co-author of *Jones & de Villars’ Principles of Administrative Law* (6th edition 2014), co-editor of the *Administrative Law Reports*, and author of numerous articles and comments in various law reviews, David was the co-recipient of the 2009 Medal from the Council of Canadian Administrative Tribunals and received the 2012 Distinguished Service Award for Legal Scholarship from the Law Society of Alberta and the Alberta Branch of the Canadian Bar Association. His practice includes all areas of administrative law, commercial and labour arbitration, “point of law” opinions, and litigation.
